Eligible Candidates

All candidates must be current financial members and they must have successfully completed the Junior Participation Skill Evaluation Proficiency for U14's (200m in 5 minutes). Candidates must have turned 13 by 1st April 2023. Priority will be given to members that have not previously attended.

Eligible Leaders

This season, the Wambiri leaders will be drawn from the 2021/22 Junior Lifesaver of the Year program, all Club nominees will be invited to attend in a mentor capacity. All leaders must be current financial members and must have completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) whilst also being up to date with their proficiency.

Parent Helpers

Participating clubs are required to supply at least one parent to stay and assist with supervision, with a minimum of one female parent helper to supervise female candidates and leaders.

All adults must be current financial members and their Member Protection details (Working with Children Check) verified by their club in Surfguard.

It is a legal requirement for all volunteers attending a camp and who are supervising the children overnight to have a Working with Children Check validated. It is also advised that all volunteers in attendance should undertake the SLS Safeguarding Children and Young People Awareness module before departure.

Club Responsibilities

Clubs will be asked to endorse members once applications have been received. Clubs are responsible for collecting fees from their candidates.

Code of Conduct

All parents and program participants are advised that for the safety and enjoyment of all attendees, all rules and instructions are to be followed in order to;

- provide a safe environment for everyone involved
- to take an inclusive approach in its activities
- to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all attendees

Any candidates or leaders who are found to be jeopardising the safety and enjoyment of others will have their parents contacted, requesting that they be collected.

Medical Information

Due to Australian Government legislation, Surf Life Saving New South Wales and Far South Coast Surf Life Saving Inc cannot cover medical expenses. These can only be claimed through a medical fund. Accordingly, medical expenses incurred during the program are the participant's responsibility.

Sleeping Arrangements

The Pambula SLSC clubhouse is the accommodation venue. All attendees will be required to bring their own bedding; swag, stretcher or blow up mattress which is to be setup on the floor. Each gender will be grouped together and separated on the different levels of the building (upstairs/downstairs).

Transport Arrangements

Each participant is responsible for arranging transport to and from Pambula SLSC. Whilst participating in the program, parent helpers will be asked to transport attendees to and from certain activities in private vehicles. Drivers' licenses will be sighted by the Camp Manager.
